Windle Trust Kenya (WTK), a member of Windle International is a humanitarian education organization providing education to refugees and needy Kenyans. WTK was founded in 1977 with the belief that good education was essential if Africa was to meet the challenges it faced. WTK is working in partnership with World University Service of Canada (WUSC) to implement the Kenya Equity in Education Project- (KEEP) Phase II – a UKAid Department for International Development funded girl's education project in northern Kenya. KEEP-II will deliver significant results in terms of improved learning outcomes; increased numbers of girls remaining in school and transitioning to the next grade and a positive supportive environment that value and promotes girls learning.

In a context where there is not widespread support for girls' education, it is critical to work with Parents Associations that are part of existing school management structures towards greater understanding and support. Parents have an important role to play as champions of girls' education. They can act as enablers, or be one of the single greatest barriers to a girl completing a full cycle of education. KEEP II will sensitize school Parent Association members to gender equality issues and will train them in methods to engage other community members in support of their daughters' education.

The identified consultants will provide targeted training to members of Parents Associations drawn from 89 KEEP target schools; 56 located in the Dadaab refugee camps and surrounding host communities and 33 in the Kakuma refugee camps and surrounding host communities. The training will support Parent Association members to effectively ensure inclusive and representative school governance and promotion of improved schools performance and promotion of girls' education in their respective schools.

Duly qualified individuals/consultants will be responsible for the following:

- Development of Parent Association members training materials and modules
- Training design and delivery
- Trainees monitoring plan design and delivery
- Reporting

It is expected that the successful candidate will have:

- Thorough understanding of the establishment and functions of the Parents Associations in schools as provided for by the relevant laws of Kenya.
- Demonstrated experience working in primary and secondary schools in the targeted locations of Dadaab, Wajir South, Fafi and Turkana West Sub counties preferably training governance structures of schools in the region.

- Familiarity of the local cultural dynamics in the targeted project locations and the ability to connect with the trainees for effective gender based content delivery and adoption.
- Excellent report writing skills
- A minimum bachelor's degree in Education or the Social sciences.
