Hands On Art Workshops requires the services of a Hands On Coach and an Assistant Coach to independently design and lead weekly art workshops in 10 School Art Clubs across Kakuma and Kalobeyei Settlement and at Maggie Tent in Kakuma 1 during academic term time, as well as to oversee management of the Hands On m2 Gallery located in Kakuma 1.

The Hands On Coaches should uphold the Core UN Values, which include Integrity, Professionalism and Respect for Diversity. Accountability, Teamwork and Communication have to be maintained as Core Competencies.

- ✓ Teach junior secondary school subjects during regular and remedial classes
- ✓ Develop teaching aids for effective learning; Conduct continuous assessment tests and terminal exams
- ✓ Responsible for the proper management of classroom resources
- ✓ Cultivate parent/teacher relationships

4. Qualification

Academic

- a) All applicants must:
 - ✓ Have original UNHCR Proof of Registration
 - ✓ Strictly live in Kakuma 1 for logistical reasons
 - ✓ Be of good moral standing with no record of disciplinary action
 - ✓ Have strong interpersonal skills, self-driven, endurance and commitment
- b) Must have a minimum KCSE mean Score Grade of C+ or C
- c) Have original Primary and Secondary School Leaving certificate and result slips and any other academic documents
- d) Art-based background demonstrating a range of art-related experiences
- e) Candidates should not be currently employed by any other organisation in Kakuma and Kalobeyei Settlement
- f) Age range of candidates is 18 25
